

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE

April 19, 2022

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, April 19, 2022. Mayor Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. The clerk called the roll and all members were present except Councilmember Mary Sue McClurkin.

Minutes from the April 5th council meeting were presented. Councilmember Harley made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Councilmember Robins seconded and the vote was unanimous.

A motion was made by Elliott to approve Crown Castle's request to add a co-location to the cell tower located at 5564 Cahaba Valley Rd. Robins seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Wayne Jones, Chairman of PAZ reported he has asked for additional information on the Oliver sub-division request and hopefully it will be on next month's PAZ agenda.

Harley reported the FEMA covid relief package was filed and accepted.

Harley presented the financials for March 2022. He pointed out the increase in the budget for grants in order to accommodate the \$200K given to the four Oak Mountain schools. Harley made a motion to accept the minutes as presented and Elliott seconded. The vote was unanimous.

Bell-Guercio reported that Brian Scivley, a member of the PAZ committee has moved out of Indian Springs Village. She asked for a motion to accept Kevin Lovoy to finish Scivley's term which will run until February 26, 2028. Robins made a motion to accept Lovoy as a PAZ member and Elliott seconded. The vote was unanimous.

Residents from Indian Ridge Dr. were in attendance to get information concerning the Cahaba Valley Rd. property that has been declared a "dangerous building site." Bell-Guercio updated them on the legal proceedings that are in place.

Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 7:25 p.m.
