

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
April 3, 2018

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, April 3, 2018. Mayor Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00pm and the Boy Scouts in attendance led the Pledge of Allegiance. All Council members were present except Councilmember Elliott.

Minutes from March 20th were reviewed. Councilmember McClurkin made a motion to accept the minutes as presented and Councilmember Robins seconded the motion. The minutes stand approved.

Fire Chief Tyler reported the new ladder truck has arrived and training will commence. Also, he noted the department is still testing hydrants. Tyler also reported that there is a shortage of pain medication they carry in their medical bags. Partly because the manufacturer was located in Puerto Rico and was damaged by the recent hurricane. Currently, there is a six month to a year backorder period.

Joan Downs, Town Clerk, thanked Chief Tyler for bringing our Easter Bunny to the Easter Egg Hunt. The kids were allowed to explore the fire engine and it was a big hit with the kids as usual. Bell-Guercio reported the Easter Egg Hunt was an enormous success, and she thanked all the volunteers who made it possible. The cost of the event was below budget and the event was expanded to include, pony rides, games, food trucks and much more.

Mayor Bell-Guercio introduced Stella Tipton, who was in attendance. Ms. Tipton is running for Shelby County Probate Judge.

Councilmember Robins reported Cobb Roofing installed the leak edge on the pavilion. He also noted that Mr. Paul Stevens, the first Town Clerk and member of the Pot Hole Crew passed away peacefully at 92 years old. He was a valued member of our community.

Councilmember Whatley presented the February financials. He noted we are close to hitting budgeted revenue for the year, and we are only five months into the accounting period. Whatley moved to accept the financials as presented. Stauss seconded and the vote was unanimous. The financials stand.

Bell-Guercio reported that Shelby county held a meeting April 2nd to re-zone the property on Hwy. 119 from A-1 to E-2. This would allow a 16-lot subdivision development. The hearing was continued until June 4th. The flood maps were inconsistent. The attorney reviewing our Zoning Ordinance has been delayed. Bell-Guercio has continued to check on interest rates for CD's maturing in the near future.

Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 7:35 pm.
