

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
February 17, 2021

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Wednesday, February 17, 2021. The Tuesday meeting was cancelled due to inclement weather. Mayor Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. All Councilmembers were present except Ed Whatley.

The minutes of February 2, 2021 were reviewed. Councilmember Harley made a motion to accept minutes as presented. Councilmember Elliott seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Councilmember Robins thanked Wayne Jones for taking care of the broken pipe that caused the water leak in the drive a few weeks ago. He also reported he is still seeking installation vendors for street signs.

The January financials were presented by Harley. He reported a steady increase in monthly simple sales tax. Since there were no questions, Harley made a motion to accept financials as presented. Councilmember McClurkin seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Elliott presented current national and state vaccine statistics. He also reminded the Council that the Kiwanis Club will meet at the high school Thursday night, with County speakers giving updates and pertinent information on the covid vaccine. He noted that the community is invited.

Bell-Guercio asked the council to approve Brian Scivley to the PAZ committee. Mr. Scivley will be filling the position held by Hub Harrington and whose term expires February 26, 2022. Robins made a motion to accept this appointment and Elliott seconded. The vote was unanimous.

Bell-Guercio reported that since the Tuesday council meeting was postponed, and to ensure transparency, the sales tax ordinance will not be presented for a vote until the first meeting in March.

Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 7: 15 pm.
