

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE  
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING  
January 5, 2021

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, January 5, 2021. Due to Town Hall renovations the meeting was held at Fire Station #2 on Caldwell Mill Lane. Mayor Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. All Councilmembers were present.

The minutes of December 15, 2020 were reviewed. Councilmember Elliott made a motion to accept minutes as presented. Councilmember Harley seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Fire Chief Sipes reported that all the paperwork has been submitted to the State for reimbursement of PPE equipment purchased by ISV. State Representative Arnold Mooney was in attendance and thanked the town for providing the solution for this needed purchase.

Harley presented the November financials. There is a coding correction to be made to account 4150 but does not change the report. Harley made a motion to accept financials as presented. Councilmember Whatley seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Bell-Guercio reported that a meeting has been set with attorney Ben Goldman for January 19<sup>th</sup>, to discuss the process of sales tax implementation.

Councilmember Robins reported that a turn signal loop in the traffic light on Cahaba Valley Road and Caldwell Mill Rd., is broken. The cost to replace the loop is approximately \$1500.00. Harley made a motion to have the traffic light fixed and Elliott seconded. The vote was unanimous. Robins also reported that in his response to a resident's complaint it was brought to his attention that there is no speed limit sign in Cahaba Oaks. After discussion with the county, he learned that this is an Indian Springs street. He is going to ask the County to put up a speed limit sign and ISV will pay for it.

Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 7:15 pm.
