

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE  
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING  
July 20, 2021

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, July 20, 2021. Mayor Brenda Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance lead by Boy Scouts from troops 71 [OLV] and 533 [Oak Mt Presbyterian]. Scouts in attendance were Parker Easterling, Owen Maloney, Jayden Mockerman, Andrew Lee, Griffin Holmes, Jesse Criswell from troop 71 and Braden Huey from troop 533. All Councilmember's were present except Councilmember Dale Elliott & Mary Sue McClurkin. Town Clerk Joan Downs was absent due to illness. .

The minutes of July 6, 2021 were unavailable for review and were tabled until the next meeting.

PAZ chairman Wayne Jones reported on the PAZ meeting held 7/13/21 to review the Van Pelt Subdivision request and a re-zoning request from A-1 to E-1 by John Brenner. Jones reported the Van Pelt request was postponed pending receipt of additional information and the Brenner request was approved by PAZ and recommended to the Council for approval. This was the first reading before the Council.

ZBA Chairman Jack Mendel reported no requests for hearings before his committee.

Councilmember Harley reported ISV has received the first of two payments from the American Relief Fund of \$196,000 and he created a "Covid Relief Account" for the deposit of those funds. ISV paid Shelby County for its portion of the storm debris clean up which was \$387,368.59. ISV had applied to FEMA for potential 75% reimbursement.

Mayor Bell-Guercio reported the ISV Attorney is drafting a contract for our new Facilities Manager. She and Councilmember Harley are working with FEMA in an effort to receive a 75% reimbursement of the town funds spent on storm debris clean up. She is also seeking legal guidance from the ISV Attorney on how the American Relief Fund money can be properly used according to the federal guidelines.

An application from Encore was received requesting a license to sell beer and wine. The Council tabled the request pending approval of their business license.

Mayor Bell-Guercio reported that Founders Day will be celebrated the third Tuesday in October and initial plans have begun for the event.

The Mayor opened the meeting to any additional comments from those in attendance and Wayne Jones noted that plans were in the works for a Boy Scout project to replace the deck boards on the main bridge at the Town Hall. The Mayor requested Jones, Harley and Whatley review stabilizing/modifying the existing picnic tables.

Mayor Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 7:15 pm.
