

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE  
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING  
July 21, 2020

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, July 21, 2020. The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. All Council members were present. Due to Covid concerns, Mayor Bell-Guercio attended the meeting via Facetime.

The minutes of July 7, 2020 were reviewed. Councilmember Harley made a motion to accept minutes as presented. Councilmember Elliott seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Planning and Zoning Chairman, Wayne Jones, reported that he followed up on a complaint in Stagg Run with regard to an abandoned house. He feels the HOA has enormous powers and it would be in their best interest to pursue remediation. He will discuss with HOA. The plat map was received for the Bent Tree sub-division. A PAZ meeting will be held next month for the committee to review.

Fire Chief Tyler brought the new pump truck for the Council to view. The town's name, Indian Springs Village, on the front of the truck, identifies the home of the truck and is the only truck in the fleet that does so. Additionally, a plaque is attached to the truck with the names of the mayor and council in appreciation for all ISV has done for the NSFD during the past 30 years. Tyler also reported all new hydrants are installed and working. However, due to the heat, they will not be painted until the fall. The inspections are on their way to being complete after disruption by Covid. Breast cancer T-shirts are being picked up tomorrow and will be for sale. Long sleeves are selling for \$15 and \$10 for short sleeves.

Councilmember Whatley presented the June financials. After a brief discussion, Elliott made a motion to accept the financials as presented. Whatley seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Bell-Guercio thanked Chief Tyler for the recognition from the NSFD and how grateful we are to have them in our Town.

Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 7:25 pm.
