

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
June 5, 2018

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, May 15, 2018. Mayor Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00pm and led the Pledge of Allegiance. All Council members were present except for Brian Stauss.

Minutes from May 5, 2018 were reviewed. Councilmember Elliott made a motion to accept the minutes as presented and Councilmember Whatley seconded the motion. The minutes stand approved.

For the record, Chief Tyler submitted the May 2018 North Shelby Fire Department call report:

- Total Calls – 153
- Fire Related – 70
- Medical Related – 83

Mayor Bell-Guercio turned the meeting over to City Engineer Frazier Christy. Mr. Christy explained that The Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM) has issued a MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEM (MS4) PHASE II GENERAL PERMIT to the Town of Indian Springs Village. As a part of this Permit ISV was required to develop a “Storm Water Management Plan” (SWMP). Part of the plan includes the education of the citizens and Town Council of ISV. In compliance with this requirement, Mr. Christy stated how fortunate we are to have Ms. Beth Stewart, Director of the Cahaba River Society and Dr. Randy Haddock, Field Director of the CRS as speakers to help us understand the need for the MS4 and SWMP. A very enlightening power point slide show regarding the Cahaba River and our drinking water was presented. Ms. Stewart stated the mission of the Cahaba River Society is to restore and protect the Cahaba River Watershed and the rich diversity of life within the river. Bell-Guercio thanked them for their presentation and 30-year commitment of working to achieve their goals.

Bell-Guercio discussed 4th of July planning. Council agreed to order for 450. Price per plate will be \$10 adults and \$6 children.

Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 8:02 pm.
