March 1, 2022

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, March 1, 2022. Mayor Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm., followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Councilmembers Whatley, McClurkin and Harley were not in attendance. In attendance were Councilmembers Elliott, Robins and Bell-Guercio. There was not a quorum for the meeting. Also in attendance was Boy Scout Joe Holt of Troop 533. He was in attendance in order to acquire his “Building a Better World” requirement.

Minutes from February 15, 2022 council meeting were tabled due to lack of quorum.

Wayne Jones, Chairman of PAZ reported there will not be a PAZ meeting this month. He also informed the Council that a Boy Scout project is being planned to replace the small walkover bridge that is at the Town Hall and is in ill repair.

Robins reported that Thomas Contracting completed their Spring grounds work, including planting a Shumard Oak and additional stump grinding, but not including the bedding plants.

Robins also reported he is looking into a complaint from residents on Rockford Drive with regard to flooding due to downed trees from the tornado in Bishop Creek on Indian Springs School’s property.

Elliott reported that Robins, Bell-Guercio and himself attended the Shelby County School Show Case on Monday, February 28th. He reported the event was very impressive.

Bell-Guercio reported that per Ben Goldman’s instruction, Benny McKenzie, ISV’s “appropriate city official” will be inspecting the property on Double Oak Lane and Cahaba Valley Rd. Details will follow.

Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 7:25 p.m.
