

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
March 19, 2019

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, March 5, 2019. Mayor Brenda Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led in the Pledge of Allegiance. All councilmembers were present.

The minutes from March 5, 2019 were reviewed. Councilmember Elliott made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Councilmember Whatley seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Several resident complaints were discussed.

Wayne Jones, Chairman of PAZ reported a sub-division request is forth coming in order to accommodate a 10' driveway.

Chief Buddy Tyler, reported that pre-incident planning is on-going and will continue until the end of April. He also reported a new training program was purchased and the department will soon be paperless. He noted that outside of Station #1 new signs and landscape is being added which will improve the appearance.

Councilmember Robins reported that Wayne Jones and he met with the septic tank company. The septic tank is located under the back porch. The tank was flooded and needed to be cleaned out. The old top was replaced in order for the septic tank to be cleaned out and to be more accessible in the future. This work needed to be completed prior to new porch construction.

Robins also noted the bids for exterior renovations will take place Monday, March 25th.

Robins reported the entry apron on the handicap side of the Town Hall should be poured this coming Friday and Saturday.

Robins attended the 63 acre Rushing Farms Shelby County rezoning appeal hearing. The developer was previously granted re-zoning from E1 to E2 special district. Concerns were expressed by the community and the application was sent back to the Planning and Zoning Commission for a potential new hearing.

Councilmember Elliott recognized Signarama, who was in attendance to show the new street signs. Installation has begun and will continue next week.

Councilmember Stauss reported the email migration from Zimbra to Outlook will begin Thursday night.

Whatley asked that review of the February financials be postponed until next meeting.

Bell-Guercio thanked Adriana Vergueiro de Paula for the fantastic job she did putting together the Arts & Crafts Fair at the Indian Springs Town Hall Saturday. Five percent of the sales were donated to the Kiwanis Chromebook project. Elliott accepted the money and thanked them for their kind efforts.

Mayor Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 7:32 pm.
