

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE  
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING  
March 5, 2019

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, March 5, 2019. Mayor Brenda Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and Councilmember Ed Whatley led in the Pledge of Allegiance. All councilmembers were present.

The minutes from February 19, 2019 were reviewed. Councilmember Elliott made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Councilmember McClurkin seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Chief Buddy Tyler, reported NSCFD had 150 calls in February, 58 fire and 92 medicals. The response time was 5:19 minutes. Year-to-Date calls are 827. Chief Tyler also introduced the new Battalion Chief Robert Lawson. Lawson will be in charge of training.

Councilmember Robins reported that Wayne Jones and he held a pre-bid conference on 3/4/19 for the Town Hall Exterior Renovation project. Two qualified contractors attended the conference. Bids will be received by and opened by Town Clerk, Joan Downs on 3/25/19 at 10:00 am. Robins also reported that he met with Shelby Co. Health Department to locate the septic tank at the Town Hall. Some work needs to take place prior to the exterior renovation project. Robins also reported he approved the sign proofs to Signarama. Robins informed the council that he has been in touch with the town attorney with regard to the abandoned house in Homestead and will advise as to outcome. Per a complaint on Grimes Road flooding, Robins contacted the State and the culverts have been cleaned.

Elliott thanked the North Shelby Fire Group for their help with the Kiwanis CPR course held February 21<sup>st</sup>. He also reported that the Kiwanis club started with 14 members and is now at 35. The ISV Kiwanis Club won the top award for fastest growing club.

Whatley presented the January financial statements. Whatley noted January was a very good revenue month and expenses are tracking on schedule. Elliot made a motion to accept January financials as presented and Councilmember Stauss seconded. The vote was unanimous.

Boy Scout Winn Jones of Troop 533 presented his eagle scout project proposal to council. He proposed two, six-sided Trek board benches around the trees on the Town Hall grounds. Estimated cost is \$1000. Projected start time is next month and completed prior to June 1<sup>st</sup>. Robins made a motion to accept the project as presented and not to exceed \$1000. Stauss seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Mayor Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 7:22 pm.
