

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
May 5, 2021

The Indian Springs Village Town Council meeting that was to be held May 4, 2021 was recessed due to inclement weather and lack of a quorum. Mayor Bell-Guercio reconvened the meeting Wednesday, May 5, 2021 at 7:00 pm. Mayor Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance. All Council members were present except Councilmember Dale Elliott.

The minutes of April 21, 2021 were reviewed. Councilmember Harley made a motion to accept minutes as presented. Councilmember McClurkin seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Bell-Guercio introduced Judge Allison Boyd, Shelby County Probate Judge, to the Council and audience. She explained that Judge Boyd had asked all municipalities within Shelby county to issue a resolution to acknowledge May as Mental Health Month. Bell-Guercio presented Resolution 05-04-2021-01 proclaiming May as Mental Health Month in which the Indian Springs Village Town Council calls upon the citizens, government agencies, public and private institutions, businesses and schools in Indian Springs Village to recommit our community to increasing awareness and understanding of mental health, the steps our citizens can take to protect their mental health, and the need for appropriate and accessible services for all people with mental health conditions. Robins made a motion to accept Resolution 05-04-2021-01 as presented and Councilmember Harley seconded. The vote was unanimous.

Also, in attendance with Judge Boyd was Danette Bevins who represents the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAOMI). She gave an overview of the agency's commitments and goals for mental health.

Robins reported that the new street signs have been delivered and installation will begin next week. He also reported that the tornado debris pick up ended on April 23rd with 53,312 cubic yards of wood debris collected at a cost of \$386,512.00. He thanked the state, county, municipal agencies along with council members and volunteers for the enormous effort put into the massive cleanup. Robins also reported that he drove through town to check out the condition of the streets and culverts after the torrential downpour from last night. He called the county and state for clean out of the culverts affected.

Bell-Guercio reported that we are in the process of planning a dinner for the volunteers who worked the stations for the tornado clean up. It will be held May 25, 2021 at the pavilion.

Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 7:40 pm.
