

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE  
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING  
November 19, 2019

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, November 19, 2019. Mayor Brenda Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance. All council members were in attendance. The review of the November 5, 2019 Council Meeting minutes were waived until the next meeting. The Mayor and Council recognized Councilman Brian Stauss for 20 years of dedicated service to the Council and citizens of Indian Springs Village and awarded him a plaque stating their grateful appreciation. Brian submitted his letter of resignation to the Council as he and his wife Cathy are moving to be closer to family as their first grandchild is due any day. The Mayor and Council thanked Brian for his outstanding service and devotion to the town. In addition to serving on the Council for 20 years, Brian also served on the Planning and Zoning Commission, chairman of the Zoning Board of Adjustments and Sign Ordinance Enforcement Committee.
