

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
November 20, 2018

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, November 20, 2018. Mayor Brenda Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. All councilmembers were present except Councilmember McClurkin and Councilmember Whatley.

The Council meeting minutes of October 16th and November 6, 2018 were reviewed and approved as presented.

The Mayor introduced Hub Harvey, Shelby County EMA Supervisor and Fire Chief Buddy Tyler to discuss the outdoor warning sirens located in ISV. Harvey noted that Shelby County is updating communication towers to new digital technology. They will maintain two old towers but at this point reliability of old equipment is questionable. Chief Tyler recommended to the Council that we retire the outdoor warning sirens. The Council asked how other cities who had retired the system handled communicating this action to the citizens. Elliott suggested we table the discussion until more information is obtained with regard to communication and make this decision at a later date.

Councilmember Robins reported pavilion and outdoor water fountains have been winterized.

Elliott reported Chromebook project for Oak Mountain Schools has reached \$11,000.00.

Councilmember Stauss reported the sale of sweet gum lumber has been sold for enough money to offset the cost of milling.

The ATT & Charter Franchise agreements were discussed. The changes will be sent to the vendors for acceptance.

Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 8:00 P.M.
