

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
October 6, 2020

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, October 6, 2020. Mayor Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. All Councilmembers were present except Ed Whatley and Dale Elliott.

The minutes of September 15, 2020 were reviewed. Councilmember Harley made a motion to accept minutes as presented. Councilmember McClurkin seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Chief Randy Sipes was in attendance and reported that he is working as the new Fire Chief and Chief Tyler will be retired at the end of October.

Bell-Guercio presented Resolution 10-06-2020-01 thanking Fire Chief Eugene “Buddy” Tyler for thirty-five years of service to the North Shelby Fire District, congratulating him on his retirement and wishing him well in his future endeavors. Harley made a motion to accept resolution as presented and McClurkin seconded. The vote was unanimous.

Jack Mendel, ZBA Chairman, was in attendance and advised the council of a request from Starbuck’s to approve a drive-thru for a new store to be located in the parking lot of the Midland Properties shopping center located on Valleydale Road.

Harley presented the financials for August. After review, there were no changes or corrections therefore, he made a motion to accept the financials as presented. Robins seconded and the vote was unanimous.

A quote from Riverchase Flooring was presented to replace carpet in the meeting room to hardwood. It was decided to get another quote to include the Clerk’s office and vote at the next meeting.

Harley suggested that the ISV stickers we have should be sent out in the next *The Village Voice* in order to continue our Town branding efforts and sense of community. Harley also reported he is in touch with a sign company that will give us a cost on continuing to replace old signs through out the town. He will also check with the Shelby county to find out if we can use their poles and just replace with our logo sign. Also, he will find out who will maintain the signs.

Bell-Guercio has called a work session for October 20th at 6:00 p.m. to begin working on a nuisance and noise ordinance.

Cop Cuts mowed Cahaba Valley road from the I65 exit, passed the ISV entrance sign and up to the tree line. The drive into ISV is much more eye pleasing. It was agreed the maintenance should continue on a bi-monthly basis. The increase in cost is \$200 per month.

Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 7:50 pm.
