

INDIAN SPRINGS VILLAGE
TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
September 21, 2021

The Indian Springs Village Town Council met Tuesday, September 21, 2021. Mayor Brenda Bell-Guercio called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. All councilmembers were present.

The minutes of September 7, 2021 were reviewed, Councilmember Elliott made a motion to accept minutes as presented and Councilmember Harley seconded, the vote was unanimous.

Councilmember Robins reported that there are two trees on Oak Mountain Trail that are in the right of way and are close to becoming a problem. They are not completely dead but may soon be and the pavement is being crumbled by the roots. The council agreed we need to get pricing to take down the trees. Robins will get pricing and check with the Alabama League of Municipalities to see if we can use Road Funds for this expense.

Harley made a motion to accept the 2022 budget that was proposed at the September 7, 2021 Council meeting as presented. Elliott seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Harley also presented the August 2021 financials. After a brief discussion, he made a motion to accept the financials as presented. Robins seconded and the vote was unanimous.

Bell-Guercio presented a quote to the council for a 18' lit Christmas tree for the lawn with a quote of \$24,500 and a yearly \$3600 to put up and take down. The proposal was rejected.

Bell-Guercio also addressed the lighting for Founders Day. String lights will be purchased and installed. The picnic tables that are damaged will be removed and then it can be determined if additional seating is needed.

After discussion, it was decided that Bell-Guercio will contact all of the Oak Mountain School principals and ask them to attend our November Council meeting and present a list of grant request for projects that need funding. The Council will then decide which projects will be funded.

Mayor Bell-Guercio adjourned the meeting at 7:30 p.m.
