**Minutes of the Town of Indian Springs Village Council Meeting

SHERIFF/FIRE REPORTS:

Fire Chief Randy Sipe requested an increase to \$150,000 in next year's budget allocation. The Fire Department also made a request for \$26,500.00 for replacement of turnout gear.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS:

Council member Robins reported that Tyrus Kidd, Shelby County IT Director for Shelby County, got the security cameras back online after Wayne Jones repaired a broken cable.

Robins also reported that the ISV entry sign on 119 by I-65 was finished, the Woodfern Drive Street sign was repaired and parts for the damaged Grimes Road sign were ordered and will be repaired as soon as they come in. He also presented a quote from Reliable Signs for the 4 ISV signs to be installed at each of the Oak Mountain Schools. The project was temporarily tabled until further research could be completed.

Council member Robins reported that he is going to schedule the sanding and refinishing of the floors of the meeting room at Town Hall.
